CI Carey: Pew Results First is a resource for prevention programs

Cheryl Bartlett: In addition to best practices, should work to identify the barriers to implementing these programs.

Allison Bauer: BSAS is working on expanding training for Botvin LifeSkills program. Also need to think about metrics to prove prevention's efficacy.

Barry Keppard: How far upstream is the commission planning to work on? What is the hard definition of behavioral health that we all agree on?

Margaret Hannah: Recommend meetings at least 1.5 hours in length.

Jim Vetter: In terms of how far upstream we're looking: recommends Essentials for Childhood framework from the CDC as an example of starting at early childhood.
